

HORSES IN/OUT OF TRAINING, MARES, STALLIONS

IS MY LOT **LOW RISK** OR **HIGH RISK**?

Please see below re: classification of whether your Lot is classified as “**Low Risk**” or “**High Risk**”.

LOW RISK

For such Lots that have travelled to or are resident in Great Britain, Ireland, France, Germany, or Italy these are classified as “Low Risk”.

One set of tests, a blood test for Equine Viral Arteritis (EVA) and a clitoral swab for Contagious Equine Metritis (CEM) are required. EVA and CEM tests should be dated within 30 days of the Sale:

- Two-year-old fillies in this category do NOT require CEM certificates.
- Geldings in this category do NOT require EVA blood tests.
- Low Risk Lots that have been outside of Great Britain or Ireland since 1st January (current year) will require a blood test for Equine Infectious Anaemia (EIA) and this should be dated within 15 days of the first day of the Sale.
- Low Risk Lots arriving at Tattersalls without the correct paperwork will be stabled in our Isolation Yard and in some instances may have to be withdrawn.

HIGH RISK

For such Lots that, in the 12 months prior to the date on which the Lot sells, have travelled to any country outside of the 5 countries as stated above (for racing/breeding purposes) are classified as “High Risk”.

For High Risk Lots, two sets of tests are required, x2 blood tests for both EVA & EIA and x2 swabs for CEM (including results for Klebsiella pneumoniae and Pseudomonas aeruginosa):

- The term “High Risk” may apply to colts, fillies (inc. 2-year olds), mares, entire horses, stallions and geldings.
- EVA blood tests should be dated at least 7 days apart with the second test being within 30 days of the Sale. *
- EIA blood tests should be dated at least 7 days apart with the second test being dated within 15 days of the first day of the Sale. *
- CEM swabs should be dated at least 7 days apart with the second test being dated within 30 days of the Sale. *
- * The 1st test result must be dated from 1st January (current year).
- Vendors with High Risk Lots should upload all test results pre-Sale. Lots arriving without the correct paperwork lodged will be refused entry to Park Paddocks and may be withdrawn.
- On your Tattersalls Online Account there will be 2 fields for uploading High Risk paperwork: The 1st set of results should be uploaded to EVA/EIA/CEM and the 2nd set of results should be uploaded to EVAH/EIAH/CEMH.

All testing mediums and intervals are detailed on our website, www.tattersalls.com, and requirements will be detailed in your Tattersalls Online Account in advance of Sale. For High Risk Lots, Vendors will also be emailed pre-Sale.
