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TATTERSALLS SALES DOCUMENTATION NOTICE (JULY/OCTOBER/AUTUMN/DECEMBER ONLY)

Please read the following instructions carefully, as failure to lodge the correct documentation will result in your Lot(s) being refused entry to Park Paddocks or to outside standings designated by Tattersalls. Individual Lot requirements are listed in your Tattersalls Online Account under Bloodstock Sales, Lot Documentation. If you have any doubts regarding procedure for Sale documentation, please consult your veterinary surgeon or contact Liz Clarke in the Bloodstock Department at Tattersalls.

Health certificate templates are available to download from the Tattersalls website at www.tattersalls.com/documentation.php and there is also information on testing intervals and classification of Low and High Risk Lots.

Test results and completed forms should be uploaded to your Online Account by either yourself or your vet pre-arrival of your Lots at Park Paddocks. These will be checked and approved pre-Sale by the Bloodstock Department. There is no need to provide duplicate copies on arrival at the Sales.

1. PASSPORTS (ALL LOTS)

Passports must be lodged at the Sales Section in the Main Sales Office as soon as the horse arrives at Park Paddocks.

Please check that the markings in the passport match those of your Lot. Discrepancies must be notified immediately to the Stud Book Authority that hold the registration details of the Lot. Please also ensure that the Medicinal Treatment section of the passport (either A or B) is completed prior to Sale. **Where a passport does not contain this section, please contact Weatherbys or the relevant Stud Book Authority so that the passport may be updated IN ADVANCE OF THE SALE.**

Broodmares must be registered as such with Weatherbys or the appropriate Stud Book Authority.

Vendors of Lots coming from overseas must apply to their Stud Book Authority for export certificates to be sent to Weatherbys.

MICROCHIPS: It is compulsory for ALL Yearlings (Two-Year-Olds in the February Sale) and Breeze Up Lots to be microchipped.

2. INFLUENZA VACCINATIONS

Yearlings / Two Year Olds in February Sale: Lots must have been given the first 2 vaccinations of the primary course. Where Lots arrive at sale without these vaccinations an announcement will be made from the Rostrum and the Vendor's account debited to cover vaccination costs.

Breeze Up Horses: Lots must have had a complete course of vaccinations in accordance with current British Horseracing Authority (BHA) requirements.

Broodmares: To facilitate export of a Lot, vaccinations should be up to date at time of sale. Where a broodmare has not been vaccinated against Equine Influenza, a notice showing such Lots will be displayed in the Main Sales Office.

Horses In Training: Lots must have had a complete course of vaccinations in accordance with the current BHA requirements. Please ensure that all details of vaccinations are recorded in the horse's passport. In doubt, please consult your veterinary surgeon.

3. STRANGLES CLEARANCE CERTIFICATES (ALL LOTS)

A Strangles Health Declaration should be submitted online via your eCommerce account at least 7 days before the start of the Sale.

4. EQUINE VIRAL ARTERITIS (E.V.A.) CERTIFICATES (STALLIONS, MARES, FILLIES & COLTS IN/OUT OF TRAINING)

NOT required for Geldings/Foals/Yearlings, Two-Year-Olds in February Sale, Craven Breeze Up and Guineas Breeze Up Sales.

Your veterinary surgeon should take a blood sample within 30 days of the first day of the Sale (Enzyme-linked Immunosorbent Assay (ELISA) or Serum Neutralisation Test (SNT) are both acceptable). Lots should wherever possible be isolated after sampling. Samples must be sent to one of the following as appropriate: The Animal Health Trust (Newmarket), Newmarket Equine Hospital (NEH), Beaufort Cottage Laboratories (Newmarket), BioBest Laboratories (Pentlands Science Park, Penicuik, Midlothian), The Irish Equine Centre or Irish Department of Agriculture, Liphook Equine Hospital, Rainbow Equine Hospital, Malton or to an accredited Laboratory in the country of export approved by the local Stud Book Authority.

Where the initial test proves positive, the Lot should be isolated and re-sampled 14 days or more after the initial sampling to see whether the titre is equal to or less than the initial reading.

Please note that horses classified as "High Risk" require two blood tests for E.V.A. with the second sample taken at least 7 days after the first and must be taken within 30 days of Sale.

5. CONTAGIOUS EQUINE METRITIS (C.E.M.) CERTIFICATES (STALLIONS, MARES & FILLIES IN/OUT OF TRAINING)

For swab requirements, please refer to the C.E.M. Regulations Notice on the Info tab at our main website, www.tattersalls.com/documentation.php

NB High Risk Lots will require two sets of swabs (taken at least 7 days apart).

6. PREGNANCY CERTIFICATES (MARES BELIEVED IN FOAL) (Condition of Sale 10.5)

The relevant section of the C.E.M. certificate must be completed by your veterinary surgeon and dated within 30 days of the first day of the Sale.

7. COVERING CERTIFICATES (MARES BELIEVED IN FOAL) (Condition of Sale 10.4)

Prior to the time of Sale of the mare, either a paper covering certificate must be lodged with Tattersalls or we must have received written notification from the appropriate Stud Book Authority that the covering has been recorded electronically.

8. EQUINE INFECTIOUS ANAEMIA (E.I.A.) REQUIREMENTS

If a Lot has been outside Great Britain or Ireland since January 1st, 2019, a blood sample **must** be taken within 15 days of the first day of the Sale (ELISA or Coggins are both acceptable). **NB High Risk Lots will require two blood tests for E.I.A (taken at least 7 days apart).**

9. PRE-SALE PIROPLASMOSIS TESTING (not compulsory)

A blood sample must be taken within 15 days of the first day of Sale and be sent to an approved laboratory for testing by Indirect Immunofluorescent Antibody Test (iFAT). If the test is positive, an announcement will need to be made at time of Sale.

10. RECORD OF EHV-1,4 (RHINOPNEUMONITIS) VACCINATIONS (IN FOAL MARES)

It is a compulsory requirement for in-foal mares to be vaccinated against EHV-1,4 details of which **MUST** be recorded in the passport. **Where no vaccination programme is shown in the passport the mare will be isolated in Park Paddocks or at an outside standing and will be sold in absentia.**

11. FILLIES' EXAMINATION CERTIFICATES (FILLIES IN/OUT OF TRAINING except Breeze Up Lots)

To avoid numerous requests for examinations of their Lots during a Sale, Vendors may arrange for their veterinary surgeon to complete this form. Certificates should be dated within 30 days of the first day of Sale. **No announcement regarding these certificates will be made from the Rostrum.**

12. 15 DAY HEALTH CERTIFICATES (ALL LOTS)

Not compulsory, but helpful for Shipping Agents transporting/exporting Lots post-Sale.
