TATTERSALLS SALES 2019 EQUINE VIRAL ARTERITIS (E.V.A.) & EQUINE INFECTIOUS ANAEMIA (E.I.A.) TESTING REQUIREMENTS

If you have any doubts regarding procedure for Sales' documentation, please consult your Veterinary Surgeon or contact Liz Clarke in the Bloodstock Department at Tattersalls (0044+ (0)1638 665931). Failure to lodge the correct documentation may result in your Lot being refused entry to Park Paddocks.

E.V.A. REQUIREMENTS FOR SALES

Required for STALLIONS, MARES, FILLIES & COLTS IN/OUT OF TRAINING (including 2-year olds sold at the July, Autumn, and December Sales). Certificates should be submitted online by your Vet or to your Tattersalls Online Account.

E.V.A. testing is **NOT** required for Geldings/Foals/Yearlings nor Two-Year-Olds in the February, Craven and Guineas Sales.

- Your veterinary surgeon should take a blood sample within 30 days of the first day of the Sale (ELISA or SNT are both acceptable). Lots should wherever possible be isolated after sampling.
- Samples must be sent to one of the following as appropriate: The Animal Health Trust (Newmarket), Newmarket Equine Hospital (NEH), Beaufort Cottage Laboratories (Newmarket), BioBest Laboratories (Pentlands Science Park, Penicuik, Midlothian), the Irish Equine Centre or Irish Department of Agriculture, Liphook Equine Hospital, Rainbow Equine Hospital (Malton), or to an accredited Laboratory in the country of export approved by the local Stud Book Authority.
- Where the initial test proves positive, the Lot should be isolated and resampled 14 days or more after the initial sampling to see whether the titre is equal to or less than the initial reading.
- Please note that horses classified as "High Risk" require **TWO** blood tests for E.V.A. with the second sample taken at least 7 days after the first and must be taken within 30 days of Sale.

E.I.A. REQUIREMENTS FOR SALES

- If a Lot has been outside Great Britain or Ireland since January 1st 2019, a blood sample **MUST** be taken with 15 days of the first day of the Sale (ELISA or Coggins is acceptable) and be sent to an accredited Laboratory in the country of export approved by the local Stud Book Authority.
- "High Risk" Lots require **TWO** blood tests for E.I.A. (taken at least 7 days apart) and the second test dated within 15 days of the Sale.
- Certificates must be uploaded pre-arrival of Lots by your Vet or by yourself to your Tattersalls Online Account.
